- Absentee ballots accepted and Special Hours for Early Voting:
 October 6 - November 2
 - Absentee ballots must be received before the close of the polls on election day, or postmarked no later than the day before an election and received no later than 10 days after the close of the polls.
 - If you are unable to return your absentee ballot, you may still vote on election day but you will have to request a **Provisional Ballot** at your polling place
